The absence of close and dependable social networks is partly to blame. Co-panelist and Columbia University Professor Andrew Rundle showed ways on how neighborhoods can be designed in more human ways to lessen the impact. The presentations at the German House were followed by a passionate discussion, moderated by Heidelberg University Association's Executive Director Irmintraud Jost.

Prof. Dr. Thomas Bortfeld, Chief, Division of Medical Physics at Massachusetts General Hospital and Professor of Radiation Oncology at Harvard Medical School, has been awarded the Alfred-Breit-Preis 2016. The Deutsche Gesellschaft für Radioonkologie (DEGRO) honored the Heidelberg alumnus for his work in developing new procedures and application in the field of radiation therapy. The award is only presented for scientific research that made noticeable progress in cancer therapy. Congratulations! Dr. Bortfeld pledged to donate the 20,000 Euro prize money to Heidelberg University. Thank you so much for this very generous gift!
