EHRENDOKTORWÜRDE FOR PROF. DR. JOHN WITTE

Prof. Dr. John Witte, Director of the Center for the Study of Law and Religion at Emory University in Atlanta, received an honorary doctorate from Heidelberg University in February. The Theological Department honored his outstanding academic contributions, especially his extensive research on the interface between religion and law, and recognized his longstanding collaboration with Heidelberg University.



On November 17, Dr. Henry Jarecki, alumnus and member of Heidelberg University Association's Advisory Council, received the Order of Merit Officer's Cross in the Alte Aula in Heidelberg. Germany's president Joachim Gauck awarded the honor to Dr. Jarecki for his support of the sciences in Germany, specifically in Heidelberg, his commitment to the German-American-Jewish-relations, and his initiative to create and expand the Rescue Scholar Fund. While accepting the award, Dr. Jarecki spoke passionately about the support for refugees. An excerpt is published here.

MAX WEBER HAUS PLEDGE INCREASED

Following his generous pledge of \$200,000 over the course of four years for the renovation of the Max Weber Haus, Dr. Henry Jarecki recently pledged an additional \$50,000 for the Max Weber Haus, increasing the total amount to \$250,000. The estate on the Neckar owes its name to Max Weber, Heidelberg professor for economics and one of the most influential social scientists at the turn of the 19th and 20th centuries. Currently, the building houses the »Internationales Studienzentrum«, which prepares international high school graduates for their studies at German universities. The estate is in dire need of renovation, which will cost around 3.5 to 4 million euros.

MAX KADE VISITING PROFESSORSHIP SUCCESSFUL

Heidelberg University Association secured another scholarship for a U.S. guest professor to teach at Heidelberg University. Supported by a grant from the Max Kade Foundation, Prof. Dr. Ulrike Gerhard invited renowned urban geographer Professor David Wilson from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. He taught at the Heidelberg Center for American Studies in November and December of 2016.
